THE CV ROUNDHOUSE

An edited reprint from an article Chris McKinley, WRJ Yardmaster, had in the November issue of FOUR-NINETY-FOUR NEWS

Sunday, Nov 2. 2008. The CV round house caught fire at 1:45 pm. Bill Brigham called me – I looked out the window and saw lots of smoke. At 2:25 pm I got to the site after walking to Route 4 and found the round house fully engulfed from the south end with four ladder trucks attacking it from Hartford, Hanover, Claremont and Lebanon, as well as others to help out with a lot of pumpers in the four corners of the round house.

It was built in 1929 to house ten new MT. Type 2-10-4 steam locomotives over 120' long that were to be based in White River Junction. These were the largest to run in New England and ran at only 35 mph but could move a train of 80 cars, about what you see today on the NECR, without a helper engine. The last one left White River Junction in 1957 for the scrap line in St. Albans.

In 1995 the New England Central Railroad took over the Central Vermont and moved a switcher, naming it train 600, into the round house east side with a two-man crew to run it – mostly at night. Today there are eight NECR train crews using White River Junction as a crew base. I hope the NECR stays in White River



Junction – I'd miss seeing these fellows when they arrive and depart on their respective trains if not.

After 80 years of service the loss of White River Junction's last round house on November 2nd, 2008 will be remembered as a sad day by rail fans, railroaders and citizens alike in the Upper Valley and New England.

NEW BROADCAST STUNT AT WHITE RIVER JUNCTION

First Time Radio Has been Worked from Scene of Disaster

[Reprinted from the 11/10/2007 issue of the Chelsea Herald]

Broadcasting direct from the scene of a great catastrophe was accomplished for the first time in the history of radio Sunday afternoon, following the flood at 5 o'clock, when portable station WATT of the Edison Electric Illuminating Company of Boston, installed on the grounds of the Hartford High school at White River Junction, successfully transmitted a summary of the flood conditions.

Arriving late Sunday morning, Chief Operator Ralph Mathewson and Roger Ellis, assistant, succeeded in whipping the set into shape to operate entirely on storage batteries loaned by a local battery dealer. Over 100 towns folk gathered around the improvised studio in the school hallway to catch their first glimpse of the method of broadcasting. Lewis S. Whitcomb, in charge of the party made the introductory announcements and gave a survey of the flood scenes. He in turn was followed by newspapermen, who gave snatches of the damage wreaked by the 30-foot swell of the White and Connecticut rivers at that point, and problems facing inhabitants in reclamation work and conservation of available fresh provisions.

The station went on the air shortly after 7 o'clock again and continued at frequent intervals until after midnight.

The broadcast covered a wide territory, and was heard in Boston by several people. Lebanon and Bellows Falls residents reported clear and strong reception of the station on 400 meters, despite the fact that several large commercial stations completely blanket that territory. Many of the towns reached were cut off from communication by phone and wire, and the roads were practically impassable.

WATT and party left for Boston Monday morning.

These were created by the Hartford Historic Preservation Commission and paid for by entities in Quechee village. Signs have also been designed for each of the Historic Districts, with the Jericho Community Association members funding the ones for the Jericho Rural District, installation due in the spring. The Commission is hoping for donations toward each of the remaining districts' signs: Christian Street Rural, Wilder Village, Hartford Village, West Hartford Village and White River Junction.
